



Dr. J. P. UNGER

**D**r. J. P. Unger MD, MPH, PhD, is one of the world renowned pioneers in the field of 'public sector health management' - the management of publicly-oriented health care, disease control programmes, services, and systems. He has studied health development strategies, bound to specific ethical principles and designed to promote specific quality standards [i]. J. -P. Unger is currently senior lecturer at the ITMA, where he has been based since 1989. He has also given lectures in Holland, Ecuador, Spain, Argentina, and Morocco. He has published 33 papers in peer-reviewed journals, a book in French, and numerous non-peer reviewed documents. J.-P. Unger gained experience in health management in Kasongo [ii] (Congo) and Thies (Senegal) [iii]. Afterwards, he was in charge of the scientific guidance of health development projects in Jordan, Ecuador, Belgium [iv], Bolivia and Niger. He prepared a health sector policy paper for the European Commission (in 88-89), and was involved in national health planning in Romania, Togo, Senegal, Burkina Faso, and Cameroon. He supported the creation of a Public Health Institute in Quito, Pontificia Universidad Católica del Ecuador; and collaborated with the Universidad de San Simon, Bolivia, and the Universidad Nacional del Nordeste, Argentina.
